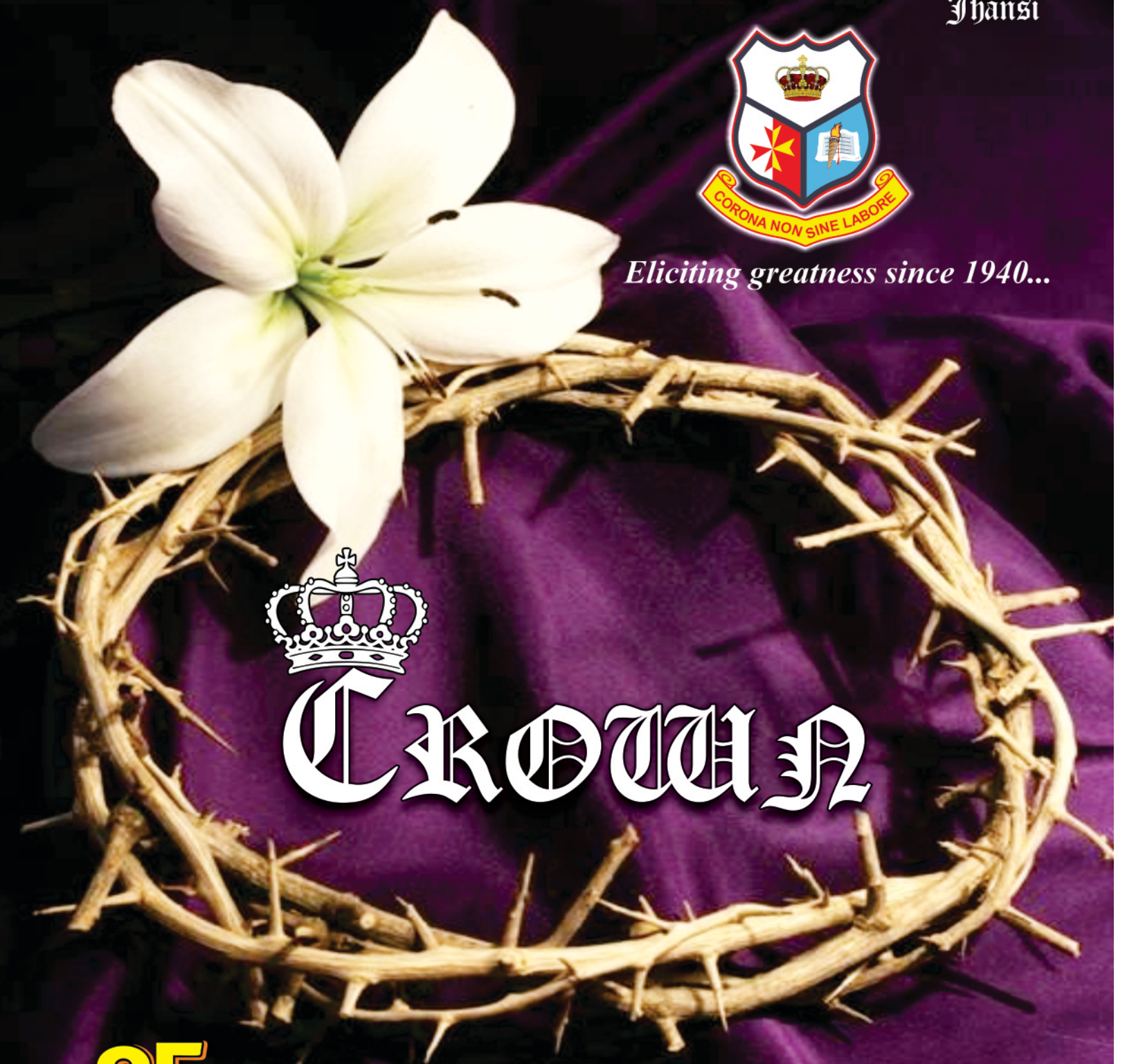

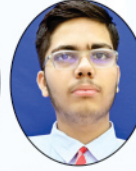

Over the decades, Christ the King College has been a beacon of holistic development, fostering intellectual curiosity, ethical values, and a sense of community among students.

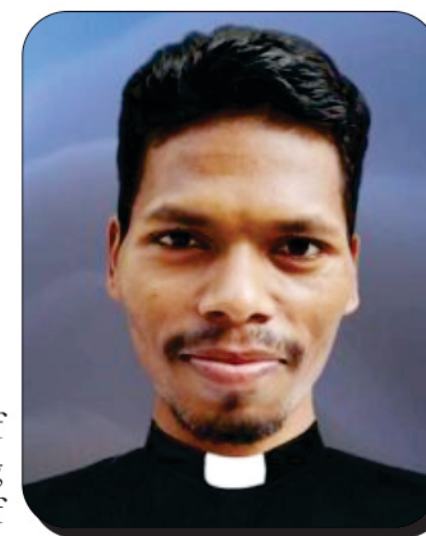

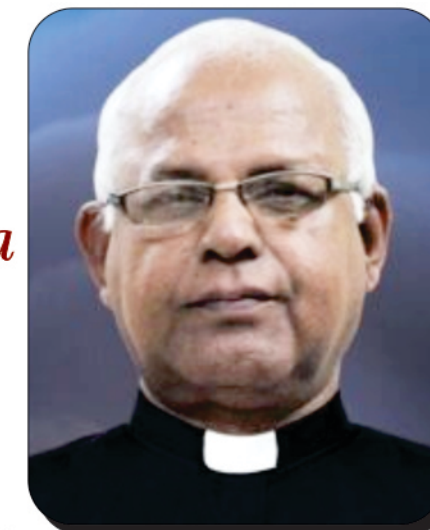

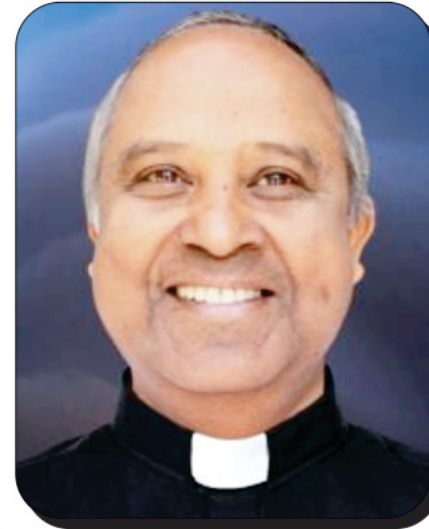
